**Sub:** Issue of Essentiality Certificate and Feasibility Certificate for starting MBBS course afresh at Sambhram Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, KGF, Kolar from the academic year 2017-18.

**Ref:** Letter No.ACA/M-98/2017-18, dated 02.05.2016 from the Registrar, Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

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The Principal, Sambhram Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, KGF has applied for affiliation for starting MBBS course afresh with an intake of 150 seats from the academic year 2017-18 at Sambhram Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, KGF.

The Syndicate of the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences has recommended to grant Essentiality and Feasibility Certificate for starting MBBS course afresh with an intake of 150 seats (One hundred and fifty) from the academic year 2017-18 in this institution vide reference above.

Government of Karnataka has considered the recommendation of the Syndicate of the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore and decided to issue the Essentiality and Feasibility Certificate for starting MBBS Course afresh with an intake of 150 seats from the academic year 2017-18 subject to the condition that the institution comes under the Comed-K association shall surrender minimum 40% of seats or the institution comes under KRLMPCA or AMPCK shall surrender minimum 25% of seats

to the Government as per the Consensual agreement to be filled through CET as per merit and reservation policy of the State Government or as per the rule prevailing for the purpose of seat sharing in Government of Karnataka.

Therefore, as per Section 10A of the MCI Act, 1956 read with Regulation 3(2) of the Medical Council of India (opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including the PG Degree Diploma course of Study or Training) and increase of admission capacity in any course of study or training (including the post graduate course of study or training) Regulation 2000, the Government of Karnataka hereby grants the Certificate of Essentiality and Feasibility for starting MBBS course afresh with an intake of 150 seats (One hundred and fifty) from the academic year 2017-18 to Sambhram Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, KGF in the prescribed format as below:

10	Full justification for opening of the proposed college.	The college is in the KGF, Kolar district with a population of around Twenty lakhs and adequate clinical material for medical teaching and clinical facilities. It would cater the medical and health needs of the locals. It possesses the basic infrastructural facilities including a functional 300 bedded hospital to effectively manage and administer the college as well as the teaching hospital. Hence, it is very much feasible to establish a new medical college in Kolar District.
11	Doctor-patient ratio proposed to be achieved.	Patient ratio will be brought down.

The Principal, Sambhram Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, KGF has applied for establishment of a medical college at KGF. On careful consideration of the proposal, the Government of Karnataka has decided to issue the Essentiality Certificate to the applicant for the establishment of a new Medical College for UG programme afresh with One Hundred and fifty seats (150) from the academic year 2017-18. It is certified that: -

- a. The applicant owns and manages a 300 bedded hospital.
- b. It is desirable to establish a medical college in the public interest;
- c. Establishment of a medical college at Bangalore is feasible.
- d. Adequate clinical material as per the Medical Council of India norms is available.

It is further certified that in case the applicant fails to create infrastructure for the medical college as per MCI norms and fresh admissions are stopped by the Central Government, the State Government shall take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the College with the permission of the Central Government.

Issuance of Essentiality and Feasibility Certificate is subject to the condition that the institution comes under the Comed-K association shall surrender minimum 40% of seats or the institution comes under KRLMPCA or AMPCK shall surrender minimum 25% of seats to the Government as per the Consensual Agreement to be filled through CET as per merit and reservation policy of the State Government or as per the rule prevailing for the purpose of seat sharing in Government of Karnataka and that the

Institution strictly adopts and adheres to the State policy on admission of students and charging of fee to medical colleges stipulated from time to time.
